**FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: RTT Volunteers to Build Wheelchair Ramp for Recent Tulsa Shooting Victim on Wednesday, September 7.**

On Wednesday, September 7, Rebuilding Together Tulsa volunteers will rally to build a ramp for a Tulsa woman who was injured by gunshot during an attempted robbery earlier this year.

Ms. Sandy lives in her home with her daughter, Julie, her son-in law and her grandson. Earlier this year, in the evening, she heard a sound outside of her home that sounded like a gunshot. To her dismay, she stepped outside of her house to see that her daughter, Julie, age 49 had been shot by three men who attempted to rob her as she entered her car to go to the grocery store. Ms. Julie is a beloved teacher at Victory and a loving wife, daughter and mother.

Ms. Julie suffered injuries that have left her wheelchair bound. She has recently returned home from the hospital but needed a wheelchair ramp and other safety modifications to make her home wheelchair accessible and a safe and healthy place for her recovery.

Rebuilding Together Tulsa volunteers will work to build a wheelchair ramp for their family on Wednesday, September 7. Volunteer work will begin at 8:30 am.
